Year 6 Leavers' Celebration and Assembly

Trip to Claremount School

Ten girls from KS2 were chosen to go on a sports afternoon at Claremount School



where they met Sam Queck and had their photograph taken with her. They also had the chance to hold her gold medal. She told them about her career and how she has become so successful within her sport. Three girls were then chosen to go and play hockey with Sam and the others went to play cricket with a lady from Cheshire Cricket Club. They played games, learnt more about the sport and about 'Team Up'

which is where you get a teddy and pass it on each time you play a fixture.

Year 6 Trip to Leasowe Lighthouse



The trip was the second in three parts of a unit of work regarding Leasowe Lighthouse. The children had learnt facts about how and when the lighthouse was built, how it worked and about the family who lived and worked there.

The children were shown artefacts in the 'Eastway Room' that the family would have used. They learnt about the hardships the family would have faced and they were fascinated by the bricks which had been made by children and had their fingerprints in. The children walked up to the top of the tower, which was 130 steps, and looked at the amazing views across to Liverpool and North Wales.



Year 4 Roman Day

The Roman day started with the children wearing togas and some came dressed as Roman soldiers. They spent the morning preparing and making Roman style food; then spent the afternoon lounging around like Romans and tasting their food.



As part of their studying of Romans in Britain, particularly Chester, Year 4 visited the Chester Grosvenor Museum where they met a Roman soldier who led them through the city to the amphitheatre. The children were shown some defence formations and given instructions in Latin. They used their shields to form a defence against the cavalry. The children then visited the museum to see artefacts which had been excavated from around Chester before having a go at grinding and preparing a Roman feast, digging up artefacts, creating mosaics and making a roman roof.



Year 3 visit Port Sunlight



The children in Year 3 had a lovely day when they visited Port Sunlight as part of their history and geography project. The children took part in a workshop at the Lyceum where they learned why

Lord Lever chose the site for his village and what life was like in Victorian Port Sunlight. They enjoyed dressing up



how household chores were done. The children loved exploring the beautiful buildings and green spaces around the village.



Foundation 2 trip to Church Farm

The children in Foundation 2 enjoyed a special day out to Church Farm. At the farm they travelled on a tractor to see lots of animals and were able to feed, stroke and hold some of them. The children also helped the farmer collect the eggs



and, after their picnic, were able to see the meercats and emus before they went to play in the maize, playground and a huge sandpit.



Year 4 and 5 Dance Festival

The children went to Claremount for the festival. On arrival they did a mass Zumba warm up with all the other schools. They then went back inside to watch the other schools' dances and to perform their own. The children enjoyed watching the other schools' performances and then performed their own so confidently.

Year 5 - Spaceport



This term, as part of their earth and space topic, Year 5 visited Spaceport. The children researched about different planets, found out why there is day and night, why the moon is seen in different phases and learned about the Milky Way. It was a really fun and interactive learning experience.



Year 3 - Trip to Walker Art Gallery

Year 3 visited the Walker Art Gallery as part of their topic on British artists. They

were excited to see the real versions of paintings by some of their favourite artists. The children had time to explore the gallery as well as being "portrait detectives" with the gallery staff, looking for clues in paintings and trying their hand at their own self-portraits.











Year 6 Merseyrail Trip

This trip was arranged and funded by Mersey Travel to show children how to use public transport safely before they transition to Secondary School.



The trip involved escorted travel on the train, bus and ferries and a look at the travel control centre. A visit under the tunnel with talks by transport police and Merseyside Police was followed by a safe trip back by train.



Reading Rewards

To celebrate the children's perseverance and stick-ability with reading this year, we invited the enchanting storyteller BB Taylor.

She reminded us about the importance of sharing stories with one another and how experimenting with words can help us with our reading and writing. BB and the children were also joined by special guest, Yoshi the Yeti. It was a fun and engaging day for all involved!
