Pupil Responses - Suggestions for Improvements

Harder books and work	<p>We are currently reviewing our whole school curriculum and ensuring that all lessons are in line with the Age Related Expectations for the Year Group but that there is challenge available for all in every lesson.</p> <p>We are currently 'Book Banding' all the reading books in Key Stage Two so it will be easier to see which books are harder.</p>
More books	For Book Week this year we will be having a Book Fair, the money raised will provide each class with a budget for updating their class libraries.
Bring the little children on to the big playground	We have set up a Buddy System for lunchtimes and from 6/11/17, the younger and older children will all be together at lunchtime.
Celebration days like own clothes day	We are relaunching the HAS as Friends of Eastway and they will be working with School and Class Councils for ideas on fundraising and fun events. We have two own clothes days planned for the Autumn Term. Children in Need and Bring a Bottle for the Christmas Fair.
More to do at playtimes and lunchtimes	We have employed a new Active Play Leader to work alongside Ms Roti at lunchtime and plan activities at playtimes. School Council raised £77.80 during the Toy and Cake Sale and are planning to buy new resources for outdoor play and Have planned further funding raising events.
More clubs	We have reviewed the clubs and have 13 new clubs starting after October half term! Thanks to all the amazing suggestions from Class Councils.
More homework to help get us ready for high school	We have reviewed the Homework that we give across school and new learning Logs have started. Year 6 will have additional homework in the lead up to SATs and in preparation for self-study expected at secondary school.
More salad bar/meal options	We had a full catering review in October and the report has been published. School Council have the food options and lunchtime arrangements as a priority on their plans.
More trips	In the review of the curriculum, we will be looking at planning enhancement days- visits or visitors every half term for every class.
More art lessons	Miss Jones will look at opportunities for every year group to engage in creative opportunities throughout the year and in their classes' curriculum.
Use the field	We will be working with HYPE to develop the school field.
Cooking classes	Mrs Smitton is taking a lead on Science and DT; she is going to look at planning these opportunities in every year group. We are looking at the possibility of extending the cookery room to create a bigger practical room for whole class cooking.
Make it quieter	We have created 'Quiet Zones' in school and are developing quieter areas for playtimes and lunchtimes.
Serious action when kids misbehave - some of them keep doing it and they don't care	The teachers will review the Behaviour Policy and look at sanctions currently in place. We will put this down as an action for our School Councillors, as it would be good to get feedback from all classes; to what you think should happen.

- School Council to collect ideas on what clubs they would like and extra-curricular activities to start from 6th November 2017.
