If you would like to donate some books, please pass these through the school office. It would be very much appreciated. When the sheds have been fully set up and loaded with books, we will open them at the end of every day and you are welcome to take a book from there to share at home. Once read, please return for others to borrow.

Reading Rewards

We will continue with our termly Reading Rewards in school. The next Reward will be on Monday 30th March. Just to clarify that children are encouraged to read at home every day and will be rewarded for this in school. We believe that quality is better than quantity and for our younger children it is not a race to read as many books as they can. Research into how young children learn to read tells us that they benefit more from rereading the same text a number of times to develop their fluency and strengthen their word recognition, all of which are essential skills that we build on in Key Stage One and continue throughout Key Stage Two.

Our School Library

Following the relocation and revamp of the school library we are timetabling slots for children to visit with their class. Every child will be encouraged to take home a 'Reading for Pleasure' book. This may not always be a book that they can read independently or be linked to their class reading scheme but for them to share with you at home. Our library is open every playtime and lunchtime for children to visit and enjoy reading.

Fostering a Love of Reading

For the next two weeks, our children will not be bringing home a reading scheme book, the usual coloured banded book but a high quality book to share with you at home. Please find time to sit and read with your child and snuggle up to enjoy a story together. These shared moments will count towards reading rewards so please do record these in the reading records. If you would like any support in encouraging your child to read at home or how you can best support them, please speak to your child's class teacher.

It will be a busy and exciting week in school for the children. If you would like to help us celebrate or are available to assist with any of the arrangements, please let me know. Each class will be arranging their own activities and we are sure your children will share these with you.
