Measuring the impact of PPG spending 2012/13

We have always used our funding to target those children who need the most support and the Pupil Premium has enabled this support to continue.

End of Key Stage 2 data over time, without the SEN resource base pupils, indicates that the provision for pupils on Free School meals (FSM) has a positive impact on their achievement.

2013 Key Stage 2 SATs Level 4 = 27 points

FSM pupils performed above their national counterparts in Reading, Writing and Maths:

National Average Point Score **Reading 26.7, Eastway 27.8**,
a difference of 1.1,

National Average Point score **Reading 26.9, Eastway 28.3**, a difference of 1.4

National Average Point score **Writing 25.9, Eastway 27.9**, a difference of 2.0

National Average Point score **Maths 27.0, Eastway 27.4**, a difference of 0.4,

National Average Point score **Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling 26.2, Eastway 27.4**, a difference of 1.2
