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World Mental Health Day 10th October 2019

This week in school children will be completing work on and raising awareness of Mental Health. The charity YoungMinds is calling on schools across the country to take part in #HelloYellow on World Mental Health Day (10th October) to show young people they're not alone with their mental health. Research shows that:

- Roughly three children in every school class have a diagnosable mental health condition
- A staggering 90% of school leaders have reported an increase in the number of students experiencing

anxiety, stress or depression over the last five years • The number of children and young people who have arrived at A&E with a psychiatric condition has more than doubled since 2010 YoungMinds is a charity partner of Heads Together, the campaign spearheaded by the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry to end the stigma around mental health. The charity also recently launched its Wise Up campaign, which calls on the government to rebalance the education system to make the wellbeing of students more of a priority in schools.
