We will be monitoring lates and more than ten lates will result in the school taking further action, as we do with attendance.

## Eco Warriors

Our Eco Council have been looking at items on the agenda and current affairs. We are growing increasingly concerned about the amount of plastic waste produced and are looking at ways in which we can reduce this. They have put a stop to the use of plastic disposable cups used by the school kitchen and are investigating alternative options for straws and plastic milk bottles.
