Year 3

As part of their RE topic Year 3 have been learning about the events of Easter. The children developed their understanding about why Christians remember this significant event. The children used drama to re-enact the events of Holy Week and celebrated their learning by taking part in the last supper and eating toasted hot cross buns.











Year 2 visit Christ Church

As part of their RE topic 'Special Places' Year 2 visited Christ Church, Moreton to better understand the significance of the church to Christians. The children met Reverend Debbi Stott, learned about her role and the importance of the church. They stretched their noticing muscles to identify key features and discussed why and how the special artefacts are used within church.

Year 6 learn about World War 2

Year 6 started their topic about WW2 with a trip to Liverpool. They visited the Museum of Liverpool, where the children hunted for clues to find out what it was like to live in Britain in the 1940s. The children visited the Piermaster's house to see what homes would have looked

like during WW2.





















Year 6 continued their learning back in school where their classroom was decorated in a WW2 theme. They enjoyed an inspiring day with members of the Cheshire Homeguard and RAF and made a huge effort preparing their outfits for the day which looked fantastic! As part of the day, the children learned how to march, follow drills and how to hold their rifle (AKA broomstick!). They learned about the role of the RAF, listened to radio messages indicating the co-ordinates of incoming hostile aircraft and planned their defence strategy. They even heard a real air raid siren and ducked for cover in an air raid shelter shelter where they sang WW2 songs. The children also had the opportunity to handle artefacts and ask questions about what it was like to live in Britain at that time. It was a brilliant day and the children really felt they were living part of History.

















Swimming

The children in Year 5 have had the opportunity to go swimming every afternoon for 2 weeks this term. It was a great chance for the children to have some quality swimming coaching and to be able to increase their skill and confidence in the water.

Year 4 visit Chester Zoo

The children visited Chester Zoo as part of their topic work on the Rainforest. They had an education session learning about the products of the Rainforest and the threats to it. The children then walked around the zoo focussing on the tropical realm and butterfly house in order to experience what it would be like in the Rainforest. Before they left the zoo the children visited as many animals as they could including a visit to the bat house.



































Football Tournament

This term the Year 5 and 6 girls football team took part in a tournament at Bebington High School. The girls performed valiantly throughout the competition and grew in confidence with each game, showing lots of energy and commitment. Year 1 Meerkat Mail

This term as part of their topic work, Year 1 were very lucky to have a visit from two meerkats and other animals including an armadillo, a python, an African tortoise, a desert lizard and a red fox. All of the animals who came originate in a similar African climate.

The children learned lots of interesting information about the Meerkats such as its tummy is like a solar panel and collects heat from the sun to keep them warm. The children then used all their new knowledge to create their own animal fact files.

As part of our partnership with Hi-Impact, twelve Year 5 & 6 children had the opportunity to watch a match at Prenton Park this term. The children waved TRFC flags as the players were welcomed on to the pitch before the first half. At half time the children went on to the pitch for a penalty shoot-out. They thoroughly enjoyed the experience and were excellent ambassadors for Eastway.











Several of the Year 5 & 6 children who are currently involved in a football based reading program, also had the chance to meet three of the youth team players. This was an inspirational experience which gave the children lots of ideas about how to stay fit and healthy. They also had the opportunity to use lots of different technology including iPads, heart rate monitors, a slow motion camera and an infra-red camera to analyse the fitness of the players.

Year 1 celebrated Chinese New Year by watching a short film clip of a real Chinese festival before creating a 'Chinese lion dance' to their own music. They listened to the rhythm of the music and played along to the beat using drums, maracas, cymbals and tambourines. The music helped the children decide whether to move fast or slow. To do a good job the children collaborated with each other, keeping close and imitating the actions of the dance leader.

The children also had a fun session tasting Chinese noodles using chopsticks and creating some wonderful Chinese craft including New Year cards, dragon puppets and paper lanterns.

Chester Zoo Safari Rangers

We were all very excited to welcome the Chester Zoo Safari Rangers to Eastway this term. We are one of only 14 schools across the region who will participate in a number of workshops with them this year. The project theme is 'Protecting our Wildlife' and will include a trip to Chester Zoo in May for all children in Years 3 - 6.









Sparkles

The Eastway Sparkles group have enjoyed some fantastic activities this term. Sparkles is a play group for parents/carers and children under 2 that meets every Thursday morning in the family centre at Eastway. New members are always very welcome to drop in. The group have enjoyed a range of activities including making Easter cards and crafts, taking part in an Easter egg hunt and a healthy eating recipe swap.









SCD1 and The Gingerbread Man

The children in SCD1 have this term enjoyed watching, reading and acting out the story of the Gingerbread man. They all used their imagination to decorate their gingerbread man using sweets and icing. In DT the children designed and made a Gingerbread man puppet out of felt adding features using pom poms, ribbon and more felt. In Science the children did an investigation to find out what would have happened to the gingerbread man if he had decided to swim across the river at the end of the story. They found out that after 20 seconds in water the Gingerbread man's head fell off and after 60 seconds he melted away, but really he went all soft and "mushy"!

This term each class held a workshop for parents / carers for them to find out about their learning and get some more ideas about how to help at home. There was also the opportunity for children to show their parents and carers their work and to have a meeting with the class teacher if they wished.

- Year 5 parents and carers learnt all about the children's spelling bee work




Year 6 parents and carers learnt about the SATs that are due to take place in May.
