Reading- Summer Reading Challenge

Go to your local Library and take part in the Summer Reading challenge. Once you have completed it bring it into school in September to celebrate with the class. See below for details:

WIRRAL libraries are hosting an exciting challenge for children to read up to six books this summer.

Children aged four to 11 can enter the challenge by borrowing and reading any six library books during the holidays by heading to their library where they will be given a collector folder to keep a reading record.

This year's theme is 'Animal Agents' based on a detective agency staffed by all kinds of clever animals who are out to crack a case at the library.

With each book they read children will then collect stickers which will help them crack the clues and help the 'Animal Agents' find out what's really been going on behind the scenes.

Writing- Send a Postcard

Attached is a postcard for you to send to school. Write about something fun you have done over the holidays or a piece of news you'd like to share. Then attach a stamp, put it in the post box and send it back to school. You may like to add a picture too!

Maths- Times Tables

Please make sure you know how to tell the time fluently to the nearest minute. By the end of Year 4, you should know all of your times tables (and their division facts) up to 12x12. Your challenge this summer is to make sure you know your 10, 2, 5, 3, 4, and 8 times tables off by heart. We will focus on the 6, 7, 9, 11 and 12s this year but you could always get a head start on those too! "Little and often" practice is the best way to learn them - 10 minutes every day. You could try:

- practise them by throwing and catching a ball
- make yourself a big number line with all the multiples and cover them with post-its one by one as you learn them
- make yourself some cards with the division fact on one side and the multiplication on the other
- draw them as arrays
- try online games like hit the button to get your speed up

Don't forget our '30 THINGS EVERY CHILD SHOULD DO BEFORE THEY LEAVE EASTWAY' challenge. You may like to cross a few of these off this summer.
