School Led Tuition

Our After School Clubs have all finished now until after the May Whit Week Holidays. The teacher led tuition will still continue every Monday. If your child has been chosen to receive additional after school lessons to help them 'catch up', please make sure that they attend all sessions. They run for 15 weeks until 4.15pm and there is no charge. Phonics Screening Check

Year 1 are going to be bringing home QR codes over the next few weeks to support them in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check in Summer 2. Parents are encouraged to scan the code and ask your child to read the read and pseudo (nonsense) words on the screen. Each QR code contains 40 words for you to practise. This is to be completed alongside our regular daily reading and spelling homework practise.
